

What? Grinder engaged in bolt bag

Significance?

Employee sustained a laceration to their lower right abdominal area.







# Preliminary ——— Incident Summary

Employee loaded their tool bag with a grinder and other tools at the end of shift. When the employee threw the bag on his shoulder to go down the stairs the grinder trigger was compressed, turning the grinder on.

# **Investigation Findings**

- Employee failed to de-energize grinder (remove the battery) which allowed it to turn on and cause the injury.
- The safety feature on the trigger was functioning properly and we believe it was compressed by another tool in the bag

# Thought Provoking Questions

- Is the tool properly stored when traveling with their power tools?
- Why wouldn't we remove the battery pack to ensure complete de-energization?

### **Corrective Actions -**

- Instructed all employees that if using an approved battery-operated tool, then all batteries shall be removed during transportation.
- · Reinspected all grinders to ensure all safety mechanisms are in proper working order
- Stand down safety meeting with all employees and sub-contractors.
- Discussions on tool energy sources and being diligent in transporting tools to and from job.



What? Grinder engaged in bolt bag

Significance?

Employee sustained a laceration to their lower right abdominal area.







## Preliminary ——— Incident Summary

Employee loaded their tool bag with a grinder and other tools at the end of shift. When the employee threw the bag on his shoulder to go down the stairs the grinder trigger was compressed, turning the grinder on.

## **Investigation Findings**

- Employee failed to de-energize grinder (remove the battery) which allowed it to turn on and cause the injury.
- The safety feature on the trigger was functioning properly and we believe it was compressed by another tool in the bag

## Thought Provoking Questions

- Is the tool properly stored when traveling with their power tools?
- Why wouldn't we remove the battery pack to ensure complete de-energization?

### **Corrective Actions -**

- Instructed all employees that if using an approved battery-operated tool, then all batteries shall be removed during transportation.
- · Reinspected all grinders to ensure all safety mechanisms are in proper working order
- Stand down safety meeting with all employees and sub-contractors.
- Discussions on tool energy sources and being diligent in transporting tools to and from job.
